


Love and Logic

- Students calm down before matter is discussed.




Day 1

- Create a class promise and have each student sign it.













Day 2








Our Color Code






Green – One Reminder – Good Yellow – Student Specific Reminder – Satisfactory Red – Loss of Privilege – Stop and think.

Days 4 & 5

- Review and practice previous procedures.
- Discuss logical consequences.
- Introduce classroom jobs.





ABUSE IT , LOSE IT	Temporary loss of privileges, equipment, items and/or activities.
INCOMPLETE WORK	Finish at recess or for homework.
DISRESPECTFUL BEHAVIOR	Separation from group – Time Out within the classroom and write an apology letter.
TALKING DURING	Separation from group. At first, timeout within the classroom. If continues send to another room for time out.
WASTING INSTRUCTIONAL TIME	Make time up at recess. Set the timer each time to show how much time was wasted and needs to be made up.
MESSING AROUND	Send to the back of the line and tries again.
POOR MANNERS	Copy and write out a list of proper manners they should exhibit.


Dear Families,

- Give students outlets to reach out.






